PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish procedures for notification of departments when the Troy Fire Department responds to and handles incidents inside that department's jurisdiction, i.e., borderline calls.

POLICY

If dispatched to an incident that turns out to be in another department's jurisdiction and that department has not yet arrived at the scene, Troy Fire Department units will operate as if the incident were in the City of Troy. The Incident Commander will advise Dispatch to notify the appropriate department, informing them of the type of incident, the exact location, and the status of the situation, i.e., whether or not additional unit(s) from their department will be needed.

When completing the MFIRS-A report, an indication shall be made in the "Mutual Aid Given" portion of the form.

If another fire department responds to an incident in the City of Troy and that department's unit(s) handle the incident without Troy units being dispatched or responding, the Troy Fire Department is to be notified. If Troy units are dispatched and responding, an attempt shall be made to determine if the other department's unit(s) require any assistance from the Troy Fire Department. The incident may then be downgraded accordingly depending upon the reply.

An MFIRS-A report shall be completed and an indication made in the "Mutual Aid Received" portion of the form.
