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Purpose

The gathering of many people at an event such as Troy Family Daze Festival (TFDF) presents unique circumstances to the Fire Department in terms of fire prevention and emergency access. This plan is intended to outline procedures for this special event.

Preparation

A Fire Department staff member will review the TFDF Emergency Operation Plan (EOP) for issues addressing fire prevention concerns, code enforcement, and fire department response and access. Prior to the event, all necessary inspections must occur and approvals granted.

Fireworks Standby & Deployment


Equipment, apparatus, or personnel required for standby during the fireworks display must be determined prior to the event in order to allow enough time for scheduling and at a minimum will include the following:

- Engine 1, staffed with a minimum of two firefighters, will stage at Talbot and Trombley to access the east downwind/fallout area.
- Brush 2, staffed with two firefighters, will stage at the southeast corner of the vendor parking area and west of the launch site in an advantageous position to access the launch site and the north and west downwind/fallout areas.
- Two staff members will stage along the south berm, between the launch site and the Arnold parking area, to access the south downwind/fallout area.

Radio Communications

Communications between Fire units at the fireworks standby will be conducted on TRF_FD2 or another available alternate Open Sky talk group.
